#### Warren County Regional Jail Offender Programs

At the Warren County Regional Jail, we implement many programs into the daily activities of our Offenders to help them better themselves when they are released. These programs range from helping Inmates get their GED to helping them re-enter society as best they can. The statistics for these programs are listed below.

#### Moral Reconation Therapy (MRT)

Moral Reconation Therapy Class began at Warren County Regional Jail in November of 2017. In this class, Offenders go over their decision making skills and how they think and determine right from wrong decisions.

#### National Career Readiness Certificate (NCRC): Est: September 2019

#### MRT Parenting Class 2019 - Est. October 2018

The Parenting Class is for Male and Female offenders. It is a class that helps offenders establishes better parenting skills, better family values, and disciplinary routines for entering back into the parent role upon release.

# P.O.R.T.A.L New Directions Program 2019 - Est. Sept. 2017

P.O.R.T.A.L stands for Parolee Orientation Re-Entry Training Assimilation Lesson. This class provides Offenders with everyday life based skills. In this class Offenders go over things like budgeting their money, general hygiene and good health, employment, and anything else an Offender might need to be successful when they re-enter society.

## MRT Relapse Prevention 2019- Est. October 2019

The relapse prevention program, *Staying Quit*, targets individuals who are active in substance abuse programs of any type in any setting.

Relapse prevention is the primary goal of treatment but focusing on relapse prevention issues should take place sometime after the client is engaged in treatment and is not actively using substances.

The relapse prevention materials are used in many settings, including behavioral health providers, substance use disorder programs, hospitals, and criminal justice settings, among a variety of other settings.

#### Soft Skills Bootcamp 2019: Est: September 2019

While today's employees are technically competent, they often lack what is commonly referred to as "Soft Skills" – Work Ready skills such as: communication, problem solving, customer service, teamwork, and conflict resolution. In fact, the most common feedback from employers, workforce development professionals and employment agencies is that while today's employees are technically competent, they often lack the important "soft skills." #### **Program Time Removal State Finances Saved:**

Due to the removal of 90 days and 30 days for Program Completion the following is an estimation of how much time was removed from the offender's sentences and money that was saved by the state for early releases:

Approximately 60.5 years were removed due to program completions It is estimated the State would have saved \$786,000 for early releases

#### State I.D. Program 2019- Est. 8/1/2018

In 2018, the Warren County Regional Jail escorted 36 Offenders to the Warren County Justice Center and helped them receive a license or identification card. Funds for this program were provided by the Southern Kentucky Reentry Council.

In 2019, the Warren County Regional Jail escorted **80 Offenders** to the Warren County Justice Center and helped them receive a license or identification card. Funds for this program were provided by the Southern Kentucky Reentry Council.

#### Birth Certificate Program 2019- Est. 8/1/2018

In 2018, Warren County Regional Jail helped **33 Offenders** obtain their birth certificate so that these Offenders have another form of Identification when released. Funds for this program were provided by the Southern Kentucky Reentry Council.

In 2019, Warren County Regional helped 100 Offenders obtain their birth certificate so that these Offenders have another form of Identification when released. Funds for this program were provided by the Southern Kentucky Reentry Council.

#### Social Security Card Program 2019: Est November 2019

In 2019, Warren County Regional Jail helped **5 Offenders** obtain their Social Security Card so that these Offenders have another form of Identification when released.

#### **Baptisms at Warren County Regional Jail**

Offenders currently incarcerated at the Warren County Regional Jail now have an opportunity to get Baptized while still incarcerated by any minister they so choose. We started this practice in April of 2018 and since then we have had **109 Offenders** get baptized.

#### Case Management 2019: Est September 2018

Case Management was developed to assist offenders within 3 months of release to prepare them with the barriers they will be facing upon release. Case Management staff assist the offender obtain Identification, Housing, Employment, Food sources, Medical insurance and other community services.

**2019: 146 Offenders** 

#### Back Pack Program 2019: Est September 2018

The back program is a partnership between the Southern Kentucky Reentry Council and the Warren County Regional Jail to supply released offenders with hygiene, stationary and other items Funds for this program were provided by the Southern Kentucky Reentry Council and donation from the public.

2019: 115 Back Packs Distributed

#### Pre-Release Class 2019-Est. September 2018

The Pre-Release Class is for Offenders that only have 90 days left and it allows outside agencies such as Community Action, Bowling Green Technological College, and small business owners to come in and talk with the Offenders about programs for them once they are released. Since this program was brought into the Warren County Regional Jail, we have had **259 Offenders** participate.

### F.R.E.E.D & L.E.A.P Program 2019: Est: July 2019

The FREED Program (Felon Reentry Equal Employment Directive) and LEAP (Linking Employment Activities Pre-Release) is formed between the Kentucky Career Center, Hope House Ministries, German American Bank and the Warren County Regional Jail to assist offenders obtain employment while housed at the Warren County Regional Jail and once they are released.

# SOUTHERN HEALTH PARTNERS OFFENDER MEDICAL / HEALTH CARE STATISTICS

At Warren County Regional Jail, we have medical on staff 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. We have Registered Nurses, Licensed Practical Nurses, Medical Technicians, and a Psychiatric Nurse on staff as well. Additionally, we have deputies assigned to assist medical with medical request, medication pass, new intakes screenings and other daily tasks that medical must perform in order to make sure every offender is receiving the proper medical care. Below are offender based medical need statistics from 2018:

#### **SUMMARY OF ROAD CREW 2019 STATISTICS**

At the Warren County Regional Jail, we have five work crews made up of Deputy Jailers and State Inmates that go out and help to clean up the communities that make up Warren County. While working, these inmates receive credit towards their sentences and state pay. Three of the five road crew deputies' salaries are reimbursed by different entities or by grant funds. In addition to normal road crew activities, WCRJ Deputies and Inmate crews worked at two community household hazardous waste collection events that were sponsored by the City of Bowling Green and Warren County Government. There were **56 deputy hours** and **192 Inmate hours** used during these two events.

These are numbers related to inmate population by month for the year of 2019. The lowest population in 2019 was 654 and the highest population in 2019 was 823. The average monthly population for the facility in 2019 was 742.
